For parents NOT employed by Pasco County Schools:

The national Take Your Daughters and Sons to Work day is scheduled for Thursday, April 27. <u>This day falls during the Year One FSA exam window</u>. There is not testing for Years 2 and 3 students on this national day. With this in mind, we will use the

same process we've used the past couple of years for parents who wish to take their children to work with them at their place of employment outside the district. A principal may allow a parent to take his or her son or daughter out of school to participate in the national event if the student DOES NOT have a scheduled FSA on Thursday, April 27, AND the parent has PREARRANGED the student's absence with his or her principal and teacher(s).

For parents employed by Pasco County Schools:

District employees who wish to bring their school-age son or daughter to work with them may do so on **Monday, May 22**. Employees also must PREARRANGE their children's absences with their principals and teachers if they plan to participate on May 22.
