Description of Arts & Design:

Physical & Health Education: Will be paired with student's choice of Design.

Agriculture: Exploration of career opportunities and job-required tasks performed in a broad range of agricultural occupations.

Culinary: Exploration of career opportunities, food safety and sanitation; safe and proper use of culinary tools/equipment; interpreting recipes and basic food preparation skills.

Coding: Students with little or no coding experience will explore operating systems, programming structures, programming design approaches, debugging/troubleshooting, and software applications.

Graphic Arts: Exploration of careers in the Arts, A/V Technology & Communications.

Band: Students with little or no instrumental experience develop foundational instrumental technique, music literacy and aesthetic musical awareness through rehearsal, performance, and study of high-quality band literature. Students may be required to attend and/or participate in rehearsals and performances outside the school day and may be required to obtain a musical instrument (e.g. borrow, rent, or purchase) from an outside source.

Chorus 1: Students with little or no choral experience develop vocal technique and skills, critical and creative thinking skills, and an appreciation of music from around the world and through time. Students may be required to attend and/or participate in rehearsals and performances outside the school day.

Art in World Cultures (*Visual Art): Students take an inquiry-based approach to exploring, researching, and analyzing works of art across time and cultures.

Dance Techniques *(Performing Art): Dance technique is a semester class designed to introduce a variety of dance techniques and genres. This class will focus on introductory movement and continually build upon previously acquired dance concepts. Basic dance vocabulary, performance skills, choreography, improvisation and performance appreciation skills will be explored.

Basic Theatre (*Performing Art): Students interested in theatre will learn the basics of theatre arts by exploring a character through such activities as pantomime, improvisation and effecting speaking using articulation, projection, and breathing.
