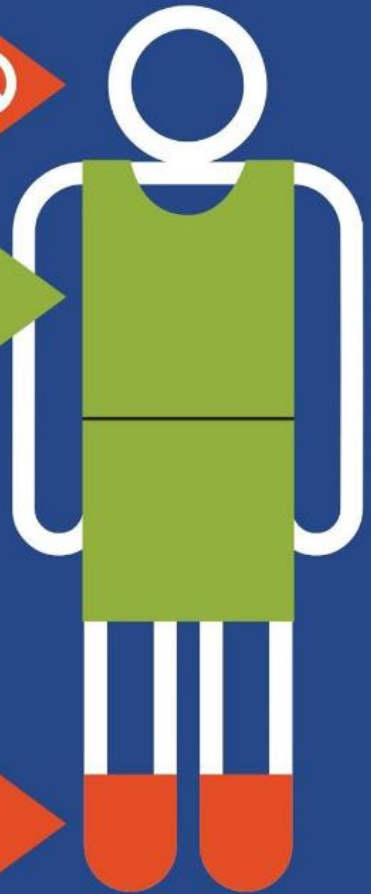
NO HEAD COVERING

The principal, or designee, shall determine the appropriateness of dress and appearance in accordance with the guidelines distributed by the school, school board policy and guidelines contained herein.

School Safety

- Corporal Elders arrives each day prior to students and staff to facilitate a campus safety check. In addition to monitoring our on-campus camera system & social media throughout the day.
- Corporal Elders works alongside administration, school counselors, and staff to educate and investigate alleged bullying and harassment.
- Safety drills take place continuously on campus throughout the school year. They are facilitated by our Schools Safety Team which is comprised of administration, Corporal Elders, and staff members.



Bullying: Zero Tolerance

- PVMS does not condone bullying of any kind.
- Students can report bullying through an incident form or speak to an adult. It is always best to communicate issues directly with the school early on.
- If you see something, say something!

PAWS POINTS

Positive Behavior Interventions & Support

Students can earn points in each class, every day by following our school wide expectations.

Points can be used to purchase prizes and activities throughout the year.

PAWS posters are displayed around the school and are specific to each area (classrooms, cafeteria, hallways, bathrooms, etc.)

- Speak kindly to your teachers and peers always.
- Speak kindly to yourself always.
- If you know how to do something that a peer is struggling with, help them.
- When you see someone else doing good work, tell them.
- Always be respectful of everyone around you no matter what.
- Treat others the way you want to be treated.

Build others up.

- Be on time to class every day.
- Bathroom break: straight to the nearest bathroom and back to class quickly.
- Complete unfinished work at home or ask for a working lunch pass.
- All Wireless Communication Devices are kept out of sight.
- Listen and don't talk when the teacher gives instruction.

Own it.

- Ask for help if you need it.
- Work on your assignments every day in class for the entire period.
- Turn in your work on time.
- Take notes when asked.
- Do not rely on others to do work for you, complete your own work.

Maximum effort.

- Throwing, running, hitting is not permitted.
- Do not touch another student's belongings without their permission.
- Always clean up after yourself before leaving class.
- Food and candy is not permitted in the classroom.

- Refusal to work/defiance

- Sleeping in class

Our PAWS school store will be open twice a month. (Specific days will be announced later)

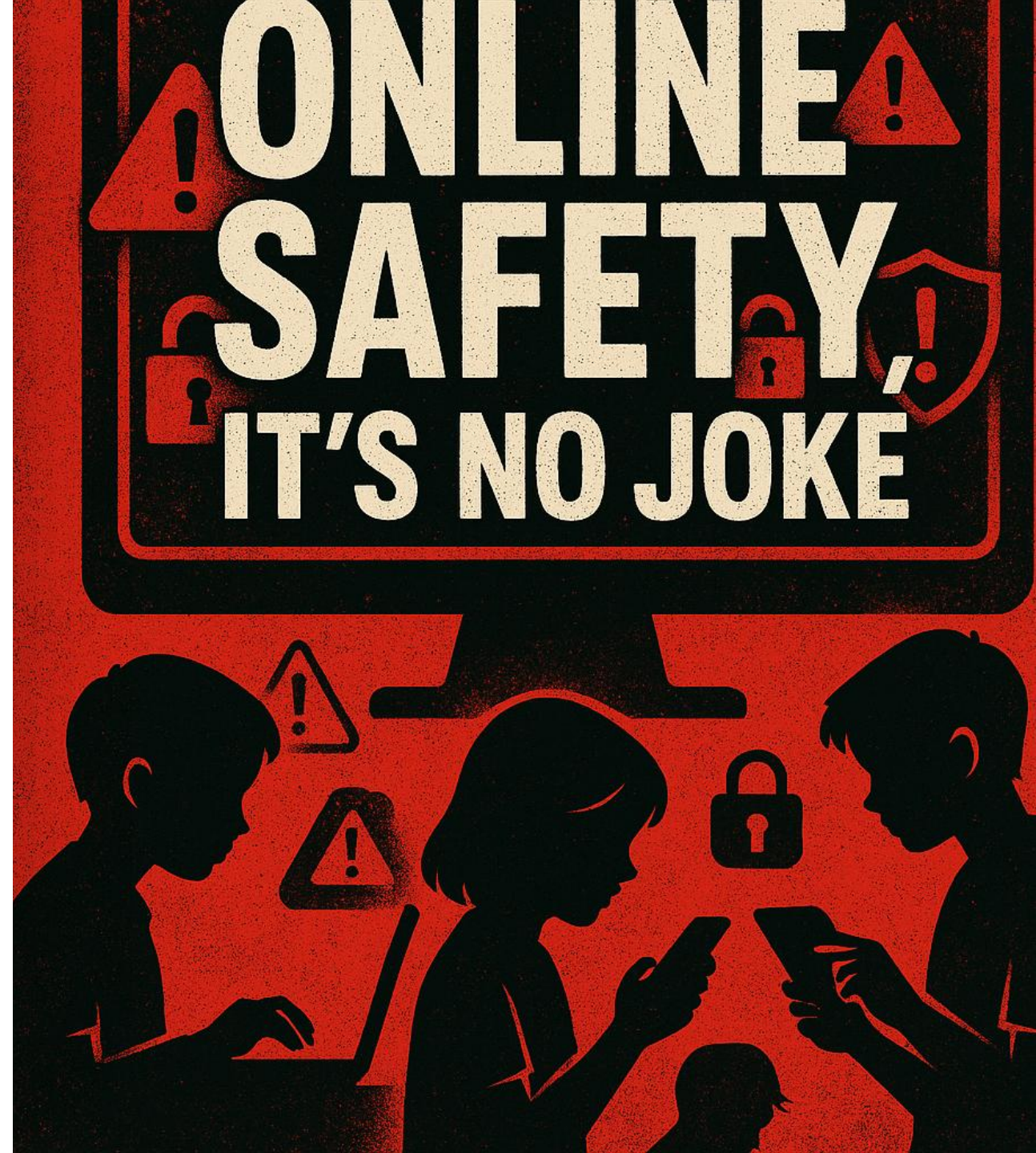
Individual teachers may have class stores where items can be purchased with points.

Your child can be arrested if they:

- **Send a threatening email or text to a student, about a student, or the school, even if it's a hoax.**
- **Send inappropriate sexual or threatening photos or text messages.**
- **Bully or harass a student or adult online.**
- **Send AI generated or manipulated content.**
- **Record or share without consent.**

What can parents do:

- **Talk OPENLY with your child about digital boundaries and legal risks.**
- **MONITOR your child's online activity and privacy settings.**
- **EDUCATE your child on what is and isn't appropriate to share or say online.**
